Forgiveness

Marjorie J. Thompson's book *Forgiveness: A Lenten Study* is our guide for the remainder of Lent. Forgiveness is at the heart of the Gospel. Jesus was plain-spoken about forgiving as a part of his expectations. Not that forgiving is easy; yet it's easier with God helping us through the Spirit of Christ. That's God's plan.

When Peter asked Jesus about how many times Peter should forgive, Jesus gave him a number that no doubt surprised him. Some translations put the number at seventy seven. Other translations favor other ancient sources and put the number at seventy *times* seven. Doing that arithmetic leads

to forgiving 490 times! (Matthew 18.21-22)

Thanks to Ms. Thompson's book, we can take forgiveness from many different angles. These angles are still ahead of us:

- † Mental Reboot, March 30
- † Freedom's Embrace, April 6
- † Beginning. Again., April 20, Easter

Even if nothing comes to mind for you about forgiveness; Even if no one comes to mind for you about forgiveness, worship with us soon. That way you'll be ready to experience and offer forgiveness when the time comes. I look forward to worshipping with you soon!

Holy Week

Holy week is called holy because it's the week when we walk with Jesus through his journey to the cross and then we experience the triumph of resurrection on Easter This year Holy Week begins on April 13 with Palm Sunday. Here's our Holy Week-specific activities

- † Palm Sunday worship, 10:00 AM, April 13. As we share in the joy of Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem we'll also remember that he came riding a small donkey instead of a grand horse. This is an important clue as to what kind of savior Jesus is. Our message, "Nice donkey!" will move us toward following the humble Christ. Plus, everyone will get a palm frond to wave. It will be fun. (You know you really like waving fronds, don't you!)
- † Maundy Thursday worship, 7:00 PM, April 17. What are you doing for diner on April 17? Be with us for a worship experience which includes a meal, much like the Passover Seder of Jesus' day.
- † Good Friday worship, 7:00 PM, April 18. This special time of remembering Jesus' sacrifice on the cross makes Easter all the more powerful.
- † <u>Easter Sunday</u> worship, 10:00 AM, April 20. Experience the clean slate, fresh start of being absolutely sure that God has triumphed and you can begin again as a forgiven and blessed child of God.

My wife, Sara, and I will again offer the ministry of <u>Soup'n Scripture</u> at noon, Monday through Friday of Holy Week. The simple meals of soup and bread remind us of the simplicity of Jesus' commitment to his Father. Sara's already planning the five soups. While the meal may be simple, the soup's always delicious! I hope you'll be with me at noon each day as we spend an hour together in table fellowship and study of God's word.



Passover Feast to be Celebrated April 17th.

"Why is this night different from all other nights?" This question is the heart and soul of the Passover feast. It is asked near the beginning by the youngest child present.

We will be celebrating this Jewish feast on April 17th at 6:30 pm because Jesus' Last Supper was a Passover feast. The feast itself is a celebration of the Hebrew's liberation



from slavery in Egypt. Many symbols represent various parts of their exodus in this beautiful feast (10 plagues, the bitterness of slavery, blood on the door posts, and the joy of freedom).

There are striking parallels between the Exodus and Jesus' ministry and sacrifice. It is not for nothing that Jesus is called the "Paschal Lamb." So, the Passover feast has deep meanings for Christians beyond its Jewish foundations.

We will be observing first century customs as much as possible – greetings, prayers, food, and actions. If

you've ever wondered what "sop" was that Jesus dipped into during that meal, come and discover what it is! The lamb stew was a poor man's main course. Other first century food s will also be served with a couple of 21st century surprises.

The feast will be led by the Rev. Jan and Paul Bond, who have celebrated the Passover annually since 1972. You must make a reservation and the first 40 to sign up will get to be a part of this special Holy Week experience. Just call the church to make your reservation before April 13th.

(Note: a free-will offering will be taken to reimburse the Bonds for the food.)

The Story of Stone Soup

Many ears ago, three soldiers, hungry and weary of battle, came upon a small village. The villagers, suffering a meager harvest and the many years of war, quickly hid what little they had to eat and met the three at the village square, wringing their hands and





bemoaning the lack of anything to eat. The soldiers spoke quietly among themselves and the first soldier then turned to the village elders. "Your tired fields have left you nothing to share, so we will share what little we have: the secret of how to make soup from stones." Naturally the villagers were intrigued an soon a fire was put to the town's greatest kettle as the soldiers dropped in three smooth stones. "Now this will be a fine soup", said the second soldier; "but a pinch of salt and some parsley would make it wonderful!" Up jumped a villager, crying "What luck! I've just remembered where some had been left!" And off she ran, returning with an apron full of parsley and a turnip. As the kettle boiled on, the memory of the village improved: soon barley, carrots, beef and

cream had found their way into the great pot, and a cask of wine was rolled into the square as all sat down to feast. They ate and danced and sang well into the night, refreshed by the feast and their new-found friends. In the morning the three soldiers awoke to find the entire village standing before them. At their feet lay a satchel of the village's best breads and cheese. "You have given us the greatest of gifts: the secret of how to make soup from stones", said an elder, "and we shall never forget." the third soldier turned to the crowd, and said: "There is no secret, but this is certain: it is only by sharing that we may make a feast". And then the soldiers continued on their journey down the road. (*The moral of the story is that by working together and everyone contributing just a little, a greater good is achieved.*)
